# Become an Enterprise Adviser

A high profile role supporting a school or college to develop long-term careers and enterprise strategies. Work alongside headteachers and careers leaders for up to one day a month and use your experience to provide a realistic and authentic approach to the world of work.

# Offer Work Experience

Work experience provides a young person with the opportunity to learn about the skills and behaviours required in the workplace and informs them about future career options. It also gives business' the opportunity to develop staff, engage with the local community and recruit potential new staff or apprentices.



#### Become an Industry Champion



Link with local schools and colleges to offer an insight into your sector through this volunteering scheme which connects you to local schools. By taking part in three skills activities such as mock interviews, career talks, apprenticeship/job fairs, work experience and mentoring, you will receive an Industry Champion badge as a sign of your dedication to improving employabilty skills.

#### Take part in Open Doors

Open Doors enables young people to visit employers premises, experience an active workplace and learn more about different industries. Visits include a tour, and a chance to meet your employees, but employers are given support in shaping the visit. Open Doors counts as an activity towards your Industry Champion badge.





#### Become a School Governor

School governors are volunteers with a range of business-related skills and life experience who play an important part in raising school standards. They do not require an educational background.
